

Why Hair Salons should be considered an essential business during this crisis:

Although we already must follow all proper sanitation requirements to ensure the safety of the consumer. The following practices should be in place during this time. Customers or Stylists that aren't feeling well should not be allowed to be on the premises. Temperatures will be taken before allowing anyone to enter.

- 1) All stylist must wear face masks and gloves, that will be disinfected and sanitized after each use.
- 2) Customers should also be wearing face masks.
- 3) Once a customer has been shampooed, the sink including the the arms and seat of the shampoo chair, must be disinfected and sanitized.
- 4) Customers should be instructed to wait in their car until their appointment. They will be called in for their appointment and the door will be opened for them.
- 5) All magazines should be removed from the waiting area.
- 6) Once a customer has had their service done, the cutting chair will be disinfected and sanitized. The cape they were wearing, removed and replaced.
- 7) When a customer is cashing out and rescheduling, they must use their own pens and the counter disinfected and sanitized after. Only one customer at a time during this procedure.
- 8) There shall be no more than 10 people in a salon at one time, all practicing social distancing. This may require larger salons to stagger their employees schedules.

After a client's service is done:

Stylist's should always sweep hair first

Sanitize the entire cutting chair and go into the kitchen to

Sanitize and replace the cutting cape, sanitize gloves, then *remove and replace their mask

*How does one safely remove a used cloth face covering?

Individuals should be careful not to touch their eyes, nose, and mouth when removing their face covering and wash and sanitize gloves immediately after removing the mask.

There will also be a poster hung to instruct them how to safely remove their gloves.
