

# SAFER AT HOME

## Attractions

### **Employee Protection:**

### **Attractions:**

This guidance applies to outdoor attractions and activities situated in recreational or natural settings that occur individually or in small groups. This includes centers for biking, canoe and kayak rentals, mini-golf, outdoor driving ranges, outdoor shooting ranges, small fishing charters, paint ball, outdoor guiding services (fishing, hunting, hiking), and other small group outdoor activities that are able to follow the guidance below.

Additionally, this guidance shall apply to outdoor and nature-based experiential attractions and businesses, including but not limited to: agro-tourism, outdoor walking trails, tours and paths, batting cages, zip lines, chairlifts, ropes courses/aerial parks, disk golf, open off-road vehicle tours (no enclosure), natural science centers, garden tours, diving tours and lessons, caves, petting zoos, balloon rides, helicopter and plane rides (groups fewer than 5 or with 6 feet of physical distancing between individuals or cohorts) and white water rafting.

### **General Business Process Adaptations:**

1. Attractions must incorporate social distancing into the operation of restrooms, any performance/event seating, and food service. Special consideration should be taken with parking and public transportation (shuttle buses, golf carts, carriages, etc.).
2. Admission limits will be determined for daily and hourly capacities to ensure appropriate social distancing pursuant to the Universal Guidelines.
3. Any location where people may queue up — restroom, water station, shuttle bus, food truck, exhibitor's table/tent — should have markings, where practical, to reinforce six feet of separation.
4. If shuttle buses are used, capacity should be determined by social distance limitations. Those who travel together may be seated together. Lines for buses must have clearly marked spots designating 6' distancing.
5. Organizers should consider increasing the number of entrances/exits where possible to alleviate issues with crowding.
6. Face coverings shall be required for staff and guests where close instructional interaction takes place.
7. Any seating must maintain physical distancing. Individuals or household groups may be seated together but 6 feet apart, both side-to-side and front-to-back, from other individuals or household groups.
